On May 11, 12 and 13, the Institute will hold its third annual native perennial plant sale. We have selected a beautiful array of plants that will bloom throughout the season and provide all the various food resources that butterflies, songbirds, hummingbirds, and other pollinators need to thrive.

Knowledgeable native plant and garden naturalists will be on hand to answer questions and many of the plants are in the gardens at either the Stone Harbor Bird Sanctuary or Institute for a firsthand look.
