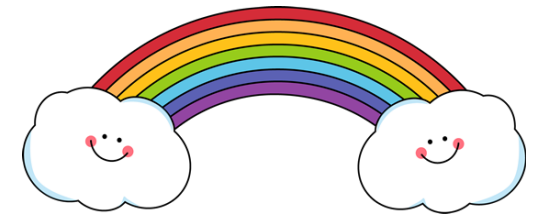


# Branching Activities for What Color is Nature?

## Paint with Mud!

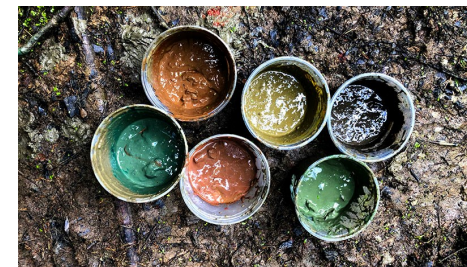
Place a handful of earth in a bowl and mix with a little water to make a muddy consistency.

Add a squirt of soap for a better flow of paint.

Experiment with different consistencies (add more or less water) to see the effect it has on your painting

If using colors, less mud, more water will bring out the best color. Powder paint will give the best effect.
